Italian greeting for Happy Birthday this year marks the Chambers 90th birthday. The Italians also have another proverb. "Anni e Eichieri di Vino non si contano mai" which means our age and glasses of wine we never count. Well, The Italian American Chamber of Commerce is very proud of their 90 years of hard work and achievements.

It all started in 1919 when a small group of professionals and business owners of Italian decent decided to express the pride of their heritage. It came at a time in our history when the Italian immigrants in this country were not readily accepted. The Italian people were all considered to be less than model citizens. They were all considered to be in the underworld or mafia as it was known back in those days. This was far from the truth even though the underworld was active then.

Through the example and exemplary work ethics of these men and their constituents the true vale, strong character, and wealth of knowledge was slowly beginning to be recognized in our metropolitan area. Through the vision and realized need to have the Italian professional and businessmen's value recognized and accepted, the Chamber was formed.

During the early days in the auto industry the workforce was being made up of many Italian immigrants. Their work ethics were unpresidential and the upper management realized and applauded how they would work diligently, often times without a break. This was something for our people to be proud of, but management was still not ready to allow our people to move beyond the workforce in the plants. There were times when in order to become part of management it was suggested the candidate, even though fully qualified, should change his name to appear more American. This was prevalent in other businesses and professions.

With these facts in mind the Italian American Chamber of Commerce encouraged the growth necessary to band together to demonstrate and prove the Italian Americans are worthy of many jobs at all levels, political, official or professional positions or business in the Detroit metropolitan area.

The meetings then were a lot different than what we enjoy now. The Chamber met in basements of homes, or at the businesses of the members with simple meals and perhaps a homemade wine. We are also told that during the two world wars, they would meet in secret, because Italians were considered to be enemies of the cause: and of course they were afraid of repercussions.
