The Italian National Anthem. A short history

The music of the Italian national anthem was composed in 1847 by Michele Novaro, to words by the young poet, Goffredo Mameli. This song, known as L'Inno di Mameli has been the national anthem of the Republic of Italy since 1948. Between 1861 (the year when Italy became a united nation) and 1946 the official anthem was the March of the House of Savoy.

The tune.

The words of the anthem were meant to call to mind past battles for freedom waged by the Lombard towns, the Florentine republic, the Genoese, together with the young Balilla, against the Austrians, the Sicilians against the French in the socalled Sicilian Vespers. The focus of all aspirations to freedom was Rome, the Rome which, in another poem, Mameli called City of memories, city of hope. On November 23, 1847

> Mameli went to take the anthem to his musician friend, Michele Novaro, who lived in Turin. Overnight the enthused Novaro composed the music, and the next day, in Genoa, Mameli brought back words and music to his companions. A few days later, on December 1,

Fratelli D'Italia was played for the first time, at a popular assembly. The tune began to run like wildfire throughout the peninsula. It was on everyone's lips.





MOTIVATIONAL MOMENTS • By William A. Morelli, Sr.

As we go though each day we are faced with having to make choices from the time we get up in the morning until we finally get to sleep at night. Each choice we make is a step on the road to greatness or to mediocrity. The following 10 choices will help guarantee you are on the right road:

- 1. Choose to be ENERGETIC instead of permitting yourself to become rundown and burned out.
- 2. Choose to be PASSIONATE instead pf permitting yourself to become aimless, apathetic and indifferent.
- 3. Choose to be ENTHUSIASTIC instead of permitting yourself to become half-hearted and discouraged.
- 4. Choose to be SELF-DIRECTED instead of permitting yourself to become directionless and uncertain.
- 5. Choose to be PREPARED instead of permitting yourself to become shortsighted and reactive.
- 6. Choose to be FOCUSED instead of permitting yourself to become scattered and impulsive.
- 7. Choose to be SUPPORTIVE instead of permitting yourself to become critical and judgmental.
- 8. Choose to be SYSTEMATIC instead of permitting yourself to become haphazard and disorganized.
- 9. Choose to be TIMELY instead of permitting yourself to become distracted and preoccupied,
- 10. Choose to be PROACTIVE instead of permitting yourself to become procrastinating and hesitant.

With the right tools, we can all learn to make these clear choices consistently and automatically. No question, it comes down to identifying exactly what's holding you back from being Energetic, Passionate. Focused, etc. - and Eliminating the root-cause - by Choosing to take smarter actions.

Grape Leaves... too many can spoil the harvest

Leaves are lovely to look at, but allow too many to thrive on a grapevine and you run the risk of harvesting less than - perfect fruit.

Grapes need abundant exposure to sunlight and fresh air in order to develop their best flavors. That's the main reason we train the shoots of the vine upward, so that the fruit hangs down below the leaves where it can catch a lot of sun. All of this time-consuming training would be for naught, however, if we

allowed too many leaves to flourish up top.

the grapes.

Let me explain. Years of grape-growing have taught us that although leaves are necessary for absorbing sunlight, they also sap energy from the vine - energy that is needed by the grapes. So it is critical to allow only those leaves to remain that are actively contributing to the vitality of the vine. Using light sensitivity meters, researchers have determined that 90% of the sunlight that benefits the vine is absorbed by the first layer of leaves. The second layer absorbs about 7% and the third layer absorbs just 3% or less. You don't need a degree in math to conclude that the third layer isn't contributing its fair share.

In fact, it's pretty safe to say that these free-loaders are probably

sapping energy from the vine that would be better spent on

So each May, crews fan out through the vineyards, twisting the third layers of leaves from the grapevines and tossing them on the ground where they will eventually decompose. As they move among the vines, they also remove any wayward leaves - regardless of layer - that might possibly shield the grape clusters from the sunlight.

Leaf-pulling not only helps the vigor of the vines and allows sunlight to reach the grapes, it also enables fresh air to flow more freely among the grape clusters. And we know from experience good air circulation significantly reduces the chances of mold growing on the fruit.

Pulling leaves by hand may sound like a lot of tedious work, and it is. But the difference that leaf pulling makes in the quality of the grapes we harvest is absolutely phenomenal. Grapes that are exposed to

abundant sunlight have much better color and flavor. Sunlight lowers the pH and lowers levels of malic acid (the bad acid) while increasing total acidity in the grapes. In short, it makes our work as winemakers a heck of a lot easier since we've got a better quality product to work with.

The most important component in a fine wine isn't barrels or bottles but premium quality grapes thanks to revolutionary new vineyard management techniques such as leaf-pulling, great grapes getting easier to come by.
